How to set up our own Break the Cycle Task Group



1. Ensure that you invite BAME teaching and non-teaching staff who will represent views of our school to our student group

Recognise that you will also need to create a 'safe spaces' for BAME students, staff and parents to voice their personal views and experiences. This requires an open and honest environment where everyone can present, in order to ensure that we can listen and respond to our students.
